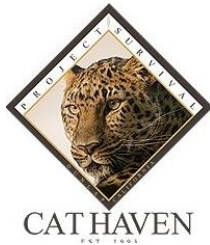


# Volunteer Training and Regulations



Let me preface by saying that most of these rules are not only Project Survival's rules, but we have these rules in place to keep in compliance with Federal and State laws.

- \_\_\_\_\_ If you are working on the tour trails you will see barriers. A barrier can be walls, railings, cables, or ropes. You must never step over or reach any body part behind or across any barrier.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Cameras and phones must stay behind all barriers at all times.
- \_\_\_\_\_ If you are working off the tour trails you must remain a MINIMUM of 6 feet away from all enclosures and all cats.
- \_\_\_\_\_ you must never touch an enclosure; you may never put your fingers, Hands, arms or any other body part into any cat cage.
- \_\_\_\_\_ you must never touch a cat
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ Before going out on to the tour trail or to any area away from the gift shop let senior staff or keepers know where you will be working and make sure you have a working radio with you at all times.
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ Do not do anything that you do not feel comfortable doing. Please let our staff know if you are afraid of heights, have allergies or similar issues so we can assign you to a task you will be comfortable helping us with.
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ If you are ever unsure if something is safe, where you should work, what tools to use, etc. Please stop and ask.

**The safety of our volunteers and our cats is always our highest priority.**
